New water near Collins shut off. White pipe by blue house stopped leaking when water shut off. Detector was used. Can hear water running. Water line being driven over. Possibly repair the 4" main by threading a 2" line through it. Is there room for 3"? Need valve work done first.</li> <li>Leakage rate determined by longest time pump is off at night – last calculated late August with maximum 150 mins. Shows very high amount of leakage.</li> <li>WTP - Stirling labeled components for maintenance logging and directions</li> <li>Cartridge filters – PSID wasn't changing due to filters bypass on. After correction, Excelpure cartridge very short-lived and patchy like Hydroscientifics.</li> <li>Forsta SS pre-filters pitting corrosion on one set, much worse on one. Usual procedure is soak in CLR to clean. Make new container from blue pipe to totally submerge. Contact manufacturer for possible causes. RJ's home SS filters have lasted 30 yrs so far. VAID still needs the Forstas even with sand filter being added – "logs and frogs".</li> <li>Meter readings showed high usage at one location – owner contacted and pressure test to be conducted.</li> <li>Coming power outage on Texada not planned for Van Anda but best be prepared anyway.</li> <li>Dam looks good.</li> </ul>	SH contact Forsta
